Hannah Kim is a Year 12 Music Scholar at Ravenswood School for Girls and is currently under the tutelage of Mrs. Elisabeth Mitchelmore. In 2020, she completed her AMusA and achieved a Distinction in her LMusA in 2021. Additionally, she secured third place at the Kendall National Violin Competition last year. This year, Hannah also received third prize in the ArsClassica International Junior Competition and came in fourth place in the 'Young' section of the Mimas Music Festival Violin Competition.

Maryann Gou has successfully completed her MMus with Garrick Ohlsson at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music and will continue her studies with him. Born in 2000, she began her musical education at the age of eight under the guidance of her mother, and later received lessons with Neta Anne Maughan AM. Maryann has participated in masterclasses with renowned pianists such as Yuja Wang, Tamara Anna-Cisłowska, Andrey Gugnin, Alexander Kobrin, and Stephen Hough.



In 2011, she showcased her talent by performing Mendelssohn's first concerto at the ABC Young Performers' Awards, and has since collaborated with orchestras performing concertos by Rachmaninoff and Tchaikovsky. She has been awarded the Margaret Chalmers Scholarship, as well as both the BlueScopeWIN and Bond & Davies Piano Scholarships. Most recently, she was recognized as a laureate of the 2024 Dallas International Piano Competition.

Patrick Phillips, aged 15, started learning cello aged 5 and is a student of Patrick Murphy. He was awarded his AMusA in 2020 and LMusA with Distinction in 2022. He has been a prize winner in many competitions, including the Australian Strings Association Concerto Competition, Australian Concerto and Vocal Competition and Queensland Symphony Orchestra's Young Instrumentalist Prize. Patrick is a cellist with Queensland Youth Symphony Orchestra and toured Singapore and Europe with them in 2023. He loves chamber music and is a member of the Timli Trio and Take Six sextet, both national finalists in Strike-A-Chord 2024.
